Satisfactory Progress (Admission Requirements & Academic Standards are listed in the UWSP Course Catalog)

- 1.) You must have a 2.25 cumulative in-major GPA including courses that transferred into the major.
- 2.) By the time you have completed 18 in-major credits, you must have at least a 2.25 in-major GPA.
- 3.) If you have not earned a 2.25 in-major GPA by the time you have earned 18 major credits, you will be dropped.
- 4.) You can be dropped if your in-major GPA is low for two consecutive semesters, after earning 18 major credits.

Additional Suggested Elective Courses

Acct 210 (Prereq for ECON 360), 211; CIS 101, 102.

For graduate work, Math 120 and 121 are suggested instead of Math 109.

The Economics major is the same regardless of the type of degree you earn (BA or BS).

Additional University Graduation Requirements
