A Few Reminders...

GENERAL ITEMS

- 1. The Annual Food Program (CACFP) & ASQ-3 paperwork was placed in all family mailboxes. Additional hardcopies can be requested in Kara's Office. The UCLCC utilizes the ASQ-3 with all families. The ASQ-3 is a developmental screener that aids the teachers in getting a better picture on where families see their child's development is at and how things are potentially similar/different in a child's behavior at home vs. school. More information about the screener can be found here: https://agesandstages.com/products-services/asq3/ Teachers will note this information at the mandatory fall conferences.
- 2. Breakfast is provided daily. If you would like your child to have a small snack beforehand, please sit with your child at a table until they have finished before leaving.
- 3. The nap baskets are rather small in size, and all your child's items must fit in their individual basket WITHOUT touching another child's. The center provides a sheet & blanket. Stuffed animals, sleeping bags, etc. tend to be too large for the baskets.
- 4. Items from home: toys, jewelry, books, etc. should remain at home. These items become an issue between the children & are often lost/broken.
- 5. The center is only licensed to provide care until 5:30pm & not before 7:30am. Be sure you are NOT signing your child in before 7:30am. Please make sure you are picking up your children AND THEN signing them out. Plan to arrive early enough to have time to go and get your children PRIOR to clocking out.

ATTENDANCE RECORDS

Families must sign their child in/out in our automated TimeClock software program upon arrival and departure daily. Each family is given a keyfob per child for the system. This compliance is a state law requiring the center to have an accurate count & whereabouts of children in attendance at all times. A penalty fee is enforced for not following this policy.

SAFETY & SECURITY

In an effort to keep the children of the UCLCC as safe as possible, we ask families to please be mindful of the following best practices:

- Do **NOT** share with your children the pin pad code to the doors or allow them to enter the code
- Do **NOT** allow your child to press any of the elevator buttons
- Do **NOT** allow your children to scan the sign in/out computer fobs
- When dropping off/picking up, always keep your child in your sight and sound (do not leave them unattended even for a brief time to put something away, grab something, etc.). Be sure that you are connecting with a UCLCC staff member when leaving your child here for the day and taking them home for the night.

FAMILIES HELPFUL TIPS CORNER

Below are a couple of Conscious Discipline items we have been implementing at the center and would encourage you to try/use at home as well. These are just a few "Helpful Words"; things that are helpful to say to children.

Here are a few examples of some of the language to use:

- 1. Teaching a child to be more assertive sounds like this: "Did you like that? Tell your friend, 'I don't like it when you (insert hurtful action), Please (insert new skill)."
- 2. Encouragement sounds like this "You (describe in detail without judgement) so (how the action impacted others). That was helpful! Example: "You picked up the toy so Jill wouldn't step on it. That was helpful."
- 3. A positive way to deal with unwanted behavior is to tell the child what you want. "You can...". We try to notice instead of judge. Example "You wanted to go down the slide, so you pushed Jill out of the way. When you want Jill to move, say "Move Jill". Try it with me. Say "Move Jill".

It is beneficial to practice the desired behavior with an adult. When children are whining or yelling, we say "match your voice to mine". Lets shift our focus from "getting children to do something" to noticing why they are doing what they are doing.

Gov. Tony Evers Tours UWSP Childcare Facility

STEVENS POINT, WI (WSAU) – Wisconsin Gov. Tony Evers toured UWSP's childcare facility on Thursday, hoping to better understand what centers need from the state.

Evers visited each classroom and spoke to teachers about their biggest concerns surrounding the industry and what they felt needed help to solve the problem. Some of the top issues they expressed included a lack of space and continuing to make wages more competitive with other industries in the area.

The theme that was stressed the most by the facility directors was the lack of space. They told Gov. Evers that, unlike other facilities around central Wisconsin, they are fully staffed and could bring in more students if they had more space to expand the classrooms.

Evers spoke about the tour and gave his views on the state's childcare industry, saying, "Thank goodness UWSP is doing this for the students and the community; it's a real bonus for them, and it's a good reminder of how important childcare is for the economy. That's why myself and the Secretary are spending a lot of time going across the state trying to build interest in this among some of the legislators' minds who consider helping to fund organizations and schools like these."

In a somewhat unexpected move, Senate leaders decided last week to formally introduce legislation to further subsidize Wisconsin's child care providers, as urged by Gov. Tony Evers. According to the Wisconsin Examiner, the bill includes a provision to continue the Child Care Counts program, which helped childcare providers with their finances during the COVID-19 outbreak, as well as another program to aid employers in covering childcare costs for their employees. The bill would provide a total of \$365 million for these programs.

Forward Analytics, the research division of the Wisconsin Counties Association, released a report last week saying that child care in Wisconsin can cost 18% to 36% of a family's income. "With record low unemployment, Wisconsin cannot afford to have people who want to work sitting on the sidelines because childcare is too expensive," the report concluded.
