Each week, the site presents a science-related article along with a corresponding worksheet for students to complete. The articles cover topics such as chemistry and materials; technology and engineering; and earth and environment. Resources for teachers and parents include an archive of past weekly questions and worksheets as well as suggested online resources. Other features are The Puzzle Zone, which presents a weekly brainteaser; the SciFi Zone, which offers science fiction composition exercises; and the Lab Zone, which contains weekly activities that encourage students to get hands-on experience with science.
