

**Is money tight?

Many students are struggling to make ends meet. If you've had to choose between eating lunch or buying gas, or could just use help paying for groceries, it's worth the time to find out if you may be eligible for FoodShare Wisconsin benefits (also known as the QUEST card).

You would be eligible if you are a student (age 18-49) enrolled for six credits or more and meet **one** of the following requirements.

- is employed at least 20 hours a week
- is participating in a state or federal work study program
- is caring for a child under age 6 or does not have adequate child care for a child under age 12
- is a single parent enrolled on a full-time basis and is caring for a child under age 12
- is enrolled in a technical school that will result in obtaining a certificate or diploma in 2 years or less, **and** is obtaining a certificate or diploma that will lead to employment that is in demand
- is receiving W-2 payments or enrolled in W-2 employment
- is physically or mentally unfit for gainful employment
- is participating in an on-the-job training program by an employer

You may also be eligible if your household's gross income is less than the amount shown per month.
