Faculty and Staff are now limited to three renewals for most library materials.

This new policy allows for materials to be checked out for a total of two years. After the two year mark, items must be physically brought back to the Circulation Desk. At the time items are returned they are also checked for holds. If no holds exist on the returned items, the patron is then able to re-check them out for another two year period*.

This policy has been put into effect to help keep our collection available not only to UWSP users, but also to users across the UW System.

*Any item that has been supplied by another UW System Library will be rerouted back to its home institution. We are not able to extend loan periods for these items beyond the two-year limit.
