

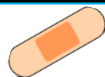

#### WILL YOU BE:

##### Graduating with your AAS this Spring?

- ⇒ Fill out the *Associates Degree and Certificate Application* in Student Affairs (Room 150)
- ⇒ Attend the Commencement ceremony on Wednesday, May 20th at 6:30 pm.



##### Attending School here at UWMC next Fall?

- ⇒ April 6th - April 10th - Registration for Fall 2015 classes begins. Check PRISM to determine what day you can register.
- ⇒ To prepare for registration students will need to:
  - Log into PRISM to view your enrollment date.
  - Read and agree to the terms and conditions (TAC) found in the PRISM student center.
  - Meet with your advisor. Stop in the student affairs office today to set up your appointment or call 715-261-6235
  - Register for your Fall classes.
- ⇒ Submit the 2015-16 FAFSA at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov)

##### Transferring to another school next Fall?

- ⇒ Submit the 2015-16 FAFSA at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov) indicating your transfer school.

#### APRIL 10!!!

All instructors will have entered your **midterm grade in PRISM** by April 10th.

To view, log into PRISM, go to the Student Center and click View My Grades.

Friday April 10th is the **last day to drop a class with a "W" grade.**

Before you drop a class you should talk to your instructor and make an appointment with an advisor to understand any consequences involved.

#### YOUR GRADES AND THE POLICIES ASSOCIATED WITH THEM

##### How does getting an F in a class affect your academic career?

- ⇒ GPA (Grade Point Average) - The GPA is determined by dividing the total number of grade points earned by the total number of credits attempted. An A = four grade points, a B = three grade points, a C = two grade points, a D = one grade point, and an F = zero grade points. If you earned an A in a 2 credit class, a B in a 3 credit class, and an F in a 5 credit class your GPA would be:  
 $(4 \text{ points} \times 2 \text{ credits}) + (3 \text{ points} \times 3 \text{ credits}) + (0 \text{ points} \times 5 \text{ credits}) / 10 \text{ credits} = 1.7 \text{ GPA}$
- ⇒ When a student is in good standing at the beginning of the semester:
  - A semester GPA of 1.5 to 1.999 will result in probation.
  - A semester GPA less than or equal to 1.499 will result in final probation.



##### What does SAP stand for and what does it mean?

- ⇒ Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)- 3 requirements that must be met to receive financial aid
  - *Pace of Progression*- Successfully completing two thirds of credits attempted
  - *GPA* - Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 when = or > 48 credits. Below 48 credits GPA requirements vary.
  - *Maximum Timeframe* - Ensures students have not attempted more than 150% of the required number of credits for their degree.
