Wausau—Before 1839 Wausau was known as Big Bull Falls due to the cataracts and rapids in the Wisconsin River. Then W.D. McIndoe proposed the adoption of the Ojibwa name Wausau to the settlement which grew up

there. This translated to "far, afar off, a great way off, distant." This could refer to either the distance and time



it took to travel to the settlement or it could refer to the far-off view from atop of Rib Mountain.

Mosinee– This city was originally known as Little Bull Falls. However, according to one account, the postmaster at this location thought the name sounded vulgar. So when a trapper came along and asked for the Indian name, he suggested Mosinee to honor Chief Mon-so-ne (Chippewa

for "Moose Tail") who was a chief at Lac Courte Oreilles in the early 19th century. The citizens of the area approved this name.



Tomahawk—The word "Tomahawk" has no close resemblance to any Wisconsin Indian term. This term first appeared in tribes found in the eastern portion of the United States as "Tamahake." This term was guickly adopted into English

and applied to both clubs and cutting tools. Most often, towns, cities, and rivers derive the name Tomahawk from a nearby lake which acquires this name because of its shape.
