November is Native American Heritage Month

Here are some local towns and their Native origins:

Wausau—from Ojibwa *wassa* meaning "a faraway place" or

"a place which can be seen from far away"

Mosinee—named to honor Chief Mon-so-ne
(Chippewa for "Moose Tail")

Shawano—from Ojibwa *zhaawanong* meaning "in, to, from the south"

Keshena—named for Menominee chief son Ke shi ene meaning "swift flying"

Antigo—clipped from Neequie antigo seepi which translates to "balsam evergreen river"
 The word antigo alone is said to signify "evergreen"
 Minocqua—from Ojibwa term minakwa meaning "a number of trees standing together"
