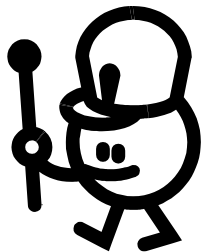


## The Purpose of NRHH

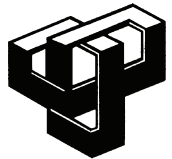
The top 1% of Student Leaders in the Residence Halls!

Each year, students spend countless hours getting involved in their residence halls. Whether it be Connect4Success Seminars, Homecoming Week, hall picnics, semi-formals, or any other hall activity, students pour their hearts and souls into making their halls an exciting, educational place to live. These students just make you sit back and



say...*"Wow...this is truly what leadership is all about!"* It's about commitment to goals, teamwork, giving to the community, academic success...but mostly, it's

about balance. Balance between all aspects of a student's life --leadership positions, academics, jobs, and personal time --is the most important goal our leaders can achieve.

But sometimes, this overwhelming dedication to the residence halls gets overlooked...nobody recognizes the outstanding contributions our students make or the balance they've reached in their busy lives as leaders. That's where National Residence Hall Honorary (NRHH) comes in! Every year, NRHH takes time out to say "Thanks" to those individuals who have made tremendous achievements and contributions within our residence hall community. This recognition occurs by inducting student leaders into our elite honorary organization, as well as providing other recognition awards throughout the year.

## Membership In NRHH

NRHH is a national organization dedicated to recognizing those who work to improve life within the halls. Membership is limited to 1% of our on-campus population (approximately 30 people).

The selection criteria is as follows:

- ***A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5***
- ***At least 2 semesters of residence hall living (including the current semester)***
- ***Currently living in the residence halls***
- ***Demonstration of outstanding service and balance within the residence hall community***
- ***Has been a role model for other students with whom he/she has had contact***

## Annual NRHH Activities

NRHH provides several recognition activities throughout the year. Following is a list of our traditional events:

- *Fall and Spring Appreciation Receptions for recognizing student leaders who are leaving our leadership teams and to recognize the accomplishments of the semester*
- *Annual NRHH Scholarships for those student leaders who have demonstrated outstanding service and dedication to the residence hall community*
- *Of-The-Month recognition program which assists the Residence Hall Association in selecting outstanding programs, student leaders, and advisors*
- *Annual selection and induction of new members into the Julie E. Zsido Chapter of the National Residence Hall Honorary at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.*

There is a selection process that a student must go through in order to become inducted into NRHH. A student must be nominated and then fill out an application. Selection of new NRHH members will be based on the application and references.
