STEINER IS UW-STEVENS POINT'S FIRST CHAMPION IN THE 26-YEAR HISTORY OF THE EVENT, WINNING THE</p>

HIGH JUMP, 55-METER HURDLES AND 1000-METER RUN WHILE FINISHING IN THE TOP FIVE OF ALL SEVEN EVENTS. STEINER WAS THIRD IN THE OVERALL HIGH JUMP WITH A LEAP OF SIX FEET, 9.75 INCHES... WHICH FOR THOSE OF YOU KEEPING TRACK IS AN NCAA PROVISIONAL QUALIFYING HEIGHT. STEINER'S ACHEIVMENTS WERE ABLE TO LEAD THE MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD TEAM TO A FOURTH PLACE FINISH. THE MEN'S TEAM TOTALED 78.5 POINTS AS UW-LA CROSSE WON ITS FIFTH STRAIGHT CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP WITH 191. THE WOMEN FINISHED SIXTH WITH 60.5 POINTS AS THE TITANS OF UW-OSHKOSH DETHRONED THE SIX-TIME DEFENDING CHAMPION EAGLES OF -LA CROSSE WITH 179.5 POINTS FOR A 13 POINT WINNING MARGIN.

IN THE WATER, THE UWSP SWIMMING AND DIVING TEAMS LOOK TO CAPTURE A TOP TEN FINISH AT THE NCAA DIVISION 3 CHAMPIONSHIPS IN MINNEAPOLIS BOTH THE MEN AND WOMEN ARE COMING OFF OF RECORD SMASHING PREFORMANCES AT THE W-I-A-C MEET. THIS WEEKEND THEY HEAD INTO ACTION WITH MULTIPLE TOP-SEEDED TIMES.

THEIR SEASONS MAY BE OVER BUT BOTH

THE MENS HOCKEY TEAM AND BOTH BASKETBALL TEAMS ARE STILL IN THE NEWS AS THE N-C-H-A AND W-I-A-C HANDED OUT THEIR ALL- CONFERENCE HONORS THIS PAST WEEKEND..

ON THE ICE POINT LANDED TWO PLAYERS ON THE ALL-N-C-H-A MEN'S HOCKEY FIRST TEAM FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR AS SENIOR DEFENSEMAN JAMES JERNBERG AND FRESHMAN FORWARD SEAN FISH BOTH EARNED THE HONOR. JERNBERG, EARNED HIS FIRST ALL-CONFERENCE SELECTION AFTER POSTING THREE GOALS AND EIGHT ASSISTS FOR 11 POINTS. JERNBERG APPEARED IN ALL 27 GAMES AND LED THE TEAM WITH 38 PENALTIES FOR THE SEASON. FISH, SHARED THE NCHA SCORING TITLE WITH SEVEN GOALS AND 12 ASSISTS FOR 19 POINTS IN LEAGUE GAMES.

MOVIN TO THE HARDWOOD..

MARSHALL NATIVE, JON KRULL RANKED THIRD IN THE CONFERENCE IN SCORING AT 16.7 POINTS PER GAME. HE ALSO WAS SIXTH IN THE LEAGUE IN ASSISTS WITH 3.26 PER GAME AND FIFTH IN STEALS WITH 1 PER GAME. KRULL ALSO LED THE POINTERS WITH 5 REBOUNDS PER GAME. KRULL WAS THE BEST IN CONFERENCE AT GETTING TO THE FREE

THROW LINE, MAKING MORE SHOTS THAN ANY OTHER LEAGUE PLAYER EVEN ATTEMPTED. HE RANKED SEVENTH IN THE LEAGUE AT 82.4 PERCENT, MAKING 168 OF 204 ATTEMPTS.

SENIOR GUARD CASSANDRA SCHULTZ HAS BEEN NAMED TO THE WOMENS TEAM. SCHULTZ IS THE 10TH PLAYER IN SCHOOL HISTORY TO EARN MULTIPLE FIRST-TEAM HONORS. SHE WAS JOINED BY JUNIOR CENTER NATHALIE LECHAULT, WHO WAS NAMED TO THE LEAGUE'S ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM AND EARNED HONORABLE MENTION ACCOLADES. UW-STEVENS POINT POSTED ITS SIXTH CONSECUTIVE 20-WIN SEASON WITH A 20-8 OVERALL RECORD AND 11-5 CONFERENCE MARK. THE POINTERS ADVANCED TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME OF THE WIAC TOURNAMENT FOR THE SECOND TIME IN THREE YEARS.

HEADIN TO THE MAT, DESPITE A TOUGH START AT THE NCAA DIVISION 3 WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS, UW-STEVENS POINT FINISHED STRONG AS ALL THREE COMPETITORS EARNED ALL-AMERICAN HONORS AND ENDED THEIR SEASONS WITH VICTORIES ON SATURDAY'S FINAL IN EWING, NEW JERSEY. THE POINTERS ENDED WITH 29.5 TEAM POINTS AND

FINISHED 11<sup>TH</sup> OVERALL. IT MARKED THE FIFTH STRAIGHT YEAR THAT UW-STEVENSON HAS PLACED IN THE TOP 12 OF TEAM STANDINGS.

BACK IN THE GREAT STATE OF WISCONSIN AS IF COMING OUT ON TOP IN THE BATTLE FOR THE N-C-H-A WOMEN'S TITLE ON SATURDAY WASN'T ENOUGH, POINT AND SUPERIOR WILL MEET AGAIN... THIS TIME WITH EVEN MORE AT STAKE. THE LEAGUE RIVALS HAVE BEEN PAIRED IN THE QUARTERFINAL ROUND OF THE NCAA DIVISION III TOURNAMENT MARCH 10 OR 11. WITH WINS IN THREE OF THE FOUR REGULAR SEASON MEETINGS, THE POINTERS EARNED THE RIGHT TO HOST THE GAME AT ICE HAWKS ARENA. THE DAWGS HANDED THE YELLOWJACKETS ALL THREE OF THEIR LOSSES THIS SEASON, INCLUDING A 4-2 SETBACK IN SATURDAY'S TITLE GAME. UWSP IS NOW 19-4-4 OVERALL AND RIDING THE LONGEST UNBEATEN STREAK IN THE COUNTRY AT 14 GAMES. THE POINTERS LEAD THE ALL-TIME SERIES WITH SUPERIOR 13-9-1 AND ARE 6-0-1 IN THE LAST SEVEN GAMES.
