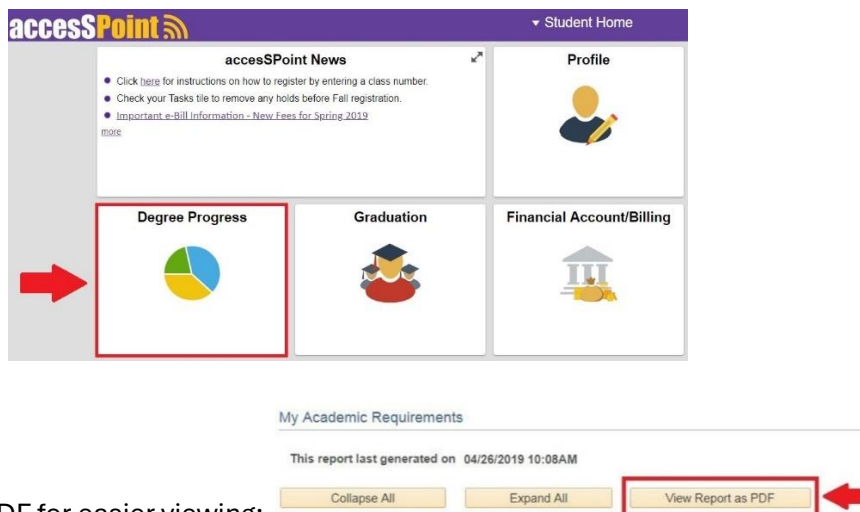


How to Read Your Degree Progress Report

This document will assist you in learning how to read important portions of your Degree Progress Report, also known as your DPR. You can find your DPR in AccesSPoint. Once you are logged in to the home page, select the “Degree Progress” tile.





Open your DPR as a PDF for easier viewing:

There are three main sections to your DPR:

1. General University Requirements
2. General Education Program (GEP) requirements
3. Major Requirements (minor and certificate requirements are also listed if declared)
4. Course History

Note: Pre-Professional declarations are also listed, however there are no university requirements to complete them. Talk with your Academic Advisor about what is required to be able to apply to your professional program.

In all the sections of the DPR, you will see each requirement as either “Not Satisfied” or “Satisfied”. The DPR assumes you will pass your in-progress courses and considers the requirements they meet as “Satisfied”. If you do not pass an in-progress course, the requirement it meets will return to showing as “Not Satisfied”.

Next you can view the credits, also known as units, you have completed for each of the university requirements. All students, regardless of their major, will need to complete a total of 120 credits. Thirty-two of those credits need to be at the 300- or 400- level. A minimum of 30 of those credits must be completed at UW-Stevens Point, if transferring in any credit.

All In-Progress courses are included in the credit total. Remedial courses (courses below 100), courses with a grade of "WV," prior attempts of repeated courses, as well as courses with a grade of W or F are not included in this total.

As you will see later in this document, you will also have a major GPA. A major GPA calculates into it only courses required for your major. Most majors at UWSP require a higher than 2.00 major GPA.

Section 2: General Education Program (GEP) Requirements

Written Communication (WC)

Most students take both ENGL 101 and ENGL 202. However, based on placement some students are required only to take ENGL 150. Your DPR will list what English courses you need to take.

Quantitative Literacy (QL)

To satisfy the Quantitative Literacy (QL) requirement, you must either:

1. Test high enough on your Math Placement Score (MATH 118, 119, or MATH 225), or
2. Take a QL course. Many majors have a built-in QL course that is required for the major, while others may have a choice of QL courses.

Any remedial math courses required (MATH 90, MATH 95) must be taken within the first 30 credits or students will be limited to enrolling into 12 credits maximum.

Wellness (WLN)

Wellness (WLN) (Line 10)

A student needs to complete one Wellness (WLN) course, and that course may be 1, 2, or 3 credits. Any amount of credit will satisfy this requirement.

Note: If you have completed Basic Training for the military, you can have this requirement met. Contact your Academic Advisor for more information.

Human Cultures and the Sciences

There are 5 categories in this area to complete:

- Arts (ART)
- Humanities (HU)
- Historical Perspectives (HP)
- Social Sciences (SS)
- Natural Sciences (NSC)

All students must complete a total of 3 credits for each category and 24 credits across these categories.

Human Cultures and the Sciences (RQ 1078)

Not Satisfied: Understanding the Physical, Social, and Cultural Worlds

· **Units:** 24.00 required, 15.00 taken, 9.00 needed

To fulfill all 24 credits, you may need to take more than one course in a category, however you can only take a maximum of 9 credits in any one category.

Arts (ART) (Line 10)

Social and Environmental Responsibility

There are 3 categories in this area to complete:

- Global Awareness (GA)
- United States Diversity (USD)
- Environmental Responsibility (ER)

Like the Human Cultures and the Sciences section, students must take 3 credits minimum for each category.

Section 3: Major Requirements (Minor and Certificate Requirements if applicable)

After both the university and GEP requirement sections, you will find your major requirements, along with minor and certificate requirements if declared. All majors list their requirements differently, so if you have any questions as you read through your DPR, contact your Academic Advisor for clarification.

Just like the GEP categories, the goal is to change all the “Unsatisfied” listings to “Satisfied”.

Read how to satisfy each area carefully as wording is critical.

For example, The DPR may state “to take all of the following” or “take the following”. This indicates that all the courses listed must be taken.

Required Certificate (Line 20)

Not Satisfied: You must have a certificate in an additional science discipline (the certificate must be a different discipline than your minor)

There could also be grade requirements for certain courses, or a minimum number of lower grades permitted to graduate from a major.

There are a variety of requirements a major might list that are not listed above, so if you have any questions about your personal DPR, talk with your Academic Advisor.

You will also find your major GPA listed. This GPA factors in only the courses required for your major and often has a different graduation requirement than the university GPA requirement of a 2.00.

The following key can help you understand what the abbreviations mean in the “Type” column.

Key to Enrollment Types/Grades

EN = Enrollment Credit; TR = Transfer Credit; IP = In-Progress Credit; TE = Test Credit; CE = Credit by Exam; OT = Other Credit; TO = Test Out; RC = Retroactive Credit; MC = Military Credit; PL = Prior Learning

In-Progress Courses & Repeats

This report assumes all courses In-Progress (IP, I, NR) will be successfully completed.

If the “Grade” column is listing a “W”, this means the student withdrew from the course and does not meet any requirements. “W” grades do not impact GPA.

Action needs to be taken on your part if you have any courses listed with an “I” or a “NR”:

- An “I” stands for “Incomplete” and means that you still need to complete coursework to receive a grade for this course. If the incomplete coursework is not completed by the end of the semester after the “I” is assigned, the grade will turn into an “F”.

- An “NR” stands for “Not Reported” and means you most likely need to submit an official transcript for grades that were in-progress at the time of reporting. If a student applies to graduate, any courses listed with an “NR” grade will not meet the requirement it is listed as meeting on the DPR.
