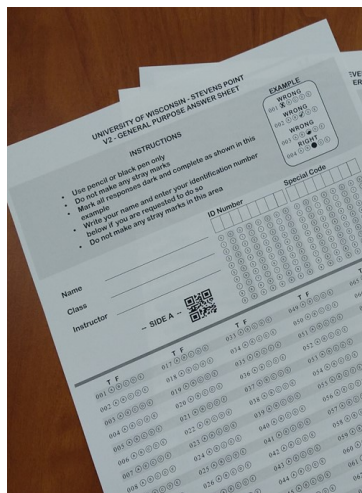

Information for Finals Week Exam Processing

Finals week is a busy time in the CITL office as we average 5,800 sheets scanned for exam scoring. Instructions and information are on our [website](#) at **Services | Test Scoring** and we offer the following checklist to ensure an efficient test scoring process. Each exam scoring packet should include:

- ✓ A completed Exam Scoring Request form
- ✓ An intercampus envelope with your return information: Instructor name, department, and building
- ✓ Your completed answer key with no stray marks
- ✓ Student answer sheets completed with **student names and IDs completed and bubbled**



Reminders:

With the large volume of packets to process during finals week, results may take up to 72 hours to appear in your OneDrive folder. All packets will be returned via campus mail.

Student answer sheets without a printed name and printed and bubbled ID number will need to be hand graded by instructors once your packet is returned via campus mail.
