CITL Program Offered for Online Course Design or Revision

he CITL is offering an Online Course Design Institute (OCDI) during Spring semester—February 24-28, daily from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. This is a synchronous workshop to design or revise online courses.

Participants are expected to attend in the CITL or to connect via Zoom. In person attendance is preferred whenever possible to get the most out of this opportunity.

During the OCDI, participants learn recommended course design principles and practices and can work with CITL staff to



start developing or revising their online courses. OCDI is an abbreviated version of the CITL online course design process.

Participants are eligible for a \$200 CITL Professional Development Grant if they attend the first session and at least three additional sessions. If you are interested, please **apply for the Spring 2020 OCDI**.

eedback is not a grade. A grade ranks a student's performance against a scale. Feedback is information about that performance that a student can use to improve. Many faculty focus on grading, but they should instead focus on feedback because the teaching comes through feedback, not the grade.

Did you know that feedback sandwiched between compliments is not effective?
