Grants and Staff Support for Online Development

he CITL team is helping develop nine new courses this fall as part of ongoing Online Program Development Grants.

Ongoing Online Program Development

Grants this fall include:

- Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) in Educational Sustainability with the School of Education (two new courses)
- Masters of Music Education with the Department of Music (four new courses)
- Medical Laboratory Technician (AS) to Clinical Laboratory Science: Medical Technology (BS) with the School of Health Sciences (three new courses)

In addition to course development for ongoing programs and new individual course development, CITL is working with two departments to develop two new online programs this fall.

New Program Development

- The Department of Psychology was awarded a New Online Program Grant to develop an Online Undergraduate Degree in Psychology, that program is expected to launch next year.
- ❖ The School of Education was awarded a New Online Program Grant to develop an Online Accelerated Certification in Elementary Education Master's Degree program which is also expected to launch next year.


We would like to invite you to join our group and welcome your suggestions for other
