

Online Course Design Institute Offered Through CITL

our CITL team has created an Online Course Design Institute designed to help instructors develop or revise fully online courses for the Summer 2020 term.

The virtual program consists of four 2-hour synchronous Zoom sessions and activities in a Canvas training course. The program will last four weeks, from April 27 - May 20.

This program is designed to introduce instructors to backward design, help instructors plan/map their overall course, introduce instructors to strategies that can help increase student engagement, help instructors build community in their online courses, explore different technologies, and fully develop at least one module in their course.

- An introduction to the concept of backward design
- How to plan/map an overall course
- Strategies to help increase student engagement
- How to build community in an online course
- An exploration of different technologies

Safe Zone training for UWSP faculty and staff members will be held through Zoom on Wednesday, May 6, 10:00 a.m.-noon.

The Safe Zone training sessions aim to improve your abilities to:

- Identify challenges faced by trans, non-binary, and non-heterosexual folks
- Help create more inclusive environments by being an ally to LGBTQ+ folks
