Join CITL for a five-part intensive institute designed to provide you with the tools, the time, and the collegial support to really dig in and design or redesign your course.

By the end of each institute, participants will have created the basic structure of a course, including plans for a syllabus, assignments, assessment tools, and a course outline. Perhaps even more importantly, they will have had a chance to exchange feedback with a diverse group of colleagues from across our university, allowing them to share their ideas about teaching and gather new ideas and insights from their peers.

Participants must commit to attending the first day and at least 3 more days of the institute to be eligible for the \$200 stipend. Please complete the **Course Design Institute application** by December 20. Registration is limited to 10 participants.

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Training Participants to Earn New Designation Placard From CITL


ompletion of the interactive workshop sessions that comprise "Toward a More Inclusive Campus" are required for all units at UWSP. The training raises awareness of diversity and inclusivity on campus, while teaching us to value diversity and understand how our experiences shape our choices. Participants learn how to be allies to underrepresented students and colleagues and to feel empowered to make change that enhances inclusivity.

It was suggested that a posted designation be given to those who have completed the training to display their commitment to inclusion as a visible notice to others, similar to the Safe Zone training placards that are issued.

The newly designed 'ALL are welcome' placards will be given to faculty and staff members completing all sessions of the training. For department members who have already completed the required training, placards will be sent to department chairs/managers for distribution in their unit/ department.



If you would like CITL to move content from D2L to Canvas, you can request the move.

D2L will be shut down permanently on June 30, 2020. After this time, we will be unable to recover any materials hosted on the D2L platform.

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Exam Scoring Checklist

inals week is a busy time in the CITL office. We offer the following checklist to ensure an efficient test scoring process.

Each Scantron exam scoring packet should include:

- √ An Exam Scoring Request Form
- $\sqrt{}$ An intercampus envelope with your return information: Instructor name, department, and building
- √ Your completed answer key with no marks on the leading edge border (the short end to the left of the name field)
- \checkmark Student answer sheets completed with No. 2 pencil, all facing the same direction and with student names and IDs completed and bubbled
- $\sqrt{}$ No blank scantron sheets included with the exams to be scored

Delivery Notes:

Test packets must be delivered in person to the CITL office at 403 Albertson Hall. The office hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. An after-hours drop slot is available.
