Are you preparing to teach a new online course, or are you ready to make a change to one you are already teaching? An Online Course Design Institute (OCDI) will be offered during the week of October 14-18.

The program is designed to help instructors develop or revise fully online courses. The program includes five in-person sessions and additional support, as requested, after the first week.

- The OCDI consists of five 2-hour workshops held in CITL.
- Participants will be eligible for a \$200 CITL Professional Development Grant if they attend the first workshop and at least three other workshops.
- We will use backward design principles during the workshops and CITL will be available throughout the term to help you as needed. You can expect that this will be an abbreviated version of the CITL online course design process.
- This will not be a Canvas training. We may get into Canvas later in the week, but these sessions will focus more on course planning/ mapping than on technology.

24th Annual UWSP Teaching Conference Call for Proposals

Il of us, as members of a college community, are undoubtedly committed to fostering student success, regardless of our roles or titles. UWSP has language to this effect in its institutional mission and vision statements, and many units that comprise our campus have included their own specific takes on this commitment to student-centeredness in their articulated values. Inarguably, student success depends on all of us in our myriad ways.

In light of this shared value of student success, as well as UWSP's efforts to improve and more effectively imbricate many student support functions through such initiatives, such as bringing the EAB Navigate platform to our campus, the theme for this year's teaching conference is "Perspectives on Student Success."

In recognition of the complexity of student support, CITL invites all faculty and staff from all UWSP campuses (regardless of title or position) to contribute to and participate in our teaching conference on Friday, January 17, 2020. Some guiding questions and themes to consider as you draft your proposals include:

- Defining Success
 - How do I define student success, and how has that definition shifted over time?
 - What are our institutional models of student success? How inclusive are they? How are they evolving as our student body changes?
 - What are some specific barriers to student success that you have successfully addressed? What lessons can you share?
- Supporting Success
 - What supports (technological and otherwise) can we use to foster student success in and out of the classroom?
- Assessing Success
 - Beyond grades and graduation rates, how do we measure and assess student success—both on an individual and an aggregate level? What else can we do to make sure our assessment of student success is robust and useful?

The teaching conference planning committee, led by CITL, will select proposals and notify presenters by Monday, December 16.

Grade Visibility to Students in Canvas

Canvas has recently changed the structure of the show/hide functions in the Gradebook in Canvas. The old settings "Mute/Unmute" allowed instructors to turn off notifications and posting of an individual grade item in the student view of the gradebook. This allowed instructors to finish grading everyone before releasing grades to anyone.

The new features allow for setting a universal policy for the course gradebook, as well as settings for individual assignments. You also have a great deal of additional control over release settings: you can opt to release grades to everyone, only to students who have submitted assignments, or individual sections of the course.
