2013-2014 Legislative Session Status

- Political Climate
 - Republican majority in both houses and Governorship for second straight session



2013-2014 Legislative Session Status

Fiscal Climate

State ending current biennium with \$400 million surplus

As compared to two years ago:

- Nearly \$4 billion state budget deficit heading into 2011-2013 biennial budget negotiations
- Most programs dealt an immediate 10% reduction



2013-2014 Legislative Session Status

 2-year session began in early January, 2013 and effectively ends mid-March, 2014
