Managing Volunteers-

- Don't micro-manage, Let them do their thing!
- If someone offers their help, find a way to use it.
- Never discourage- encourage involvement and make it meaningful.
- When recruiting volunteers- never leave a task open ended- give them a task to do, allow them to do it their way, and when complete they are done. (they will return)
