Gray squirrels like mixed hardwood forests (forests with trees that drop their leaves in the winter). Squirrels make nests, called dreys, using twigs, leaves, moss, and other natural objects. Look for them at the top of large trees!



## **FUN FACTS**

Squirrels are tree planters! The seeds and nuts that squirrels bury in the fall are not all collected and eaten; many of these seeds sprout and become new trees. Eastern gray squirrels are not always gray. Sometimes they can be black, called melanistic, or white, called albinistic.

Squirrels are omnivores (they eat both plants and animals). Their favorite foods include: acorns, seeds, nuts, berries, tree buds, insects,
