Become a Hunter Safety Instructor

Earn 1 credit while training to become a DNR certified Hunter Safety Instructor when you sign up for NRES 210. Prerequisites: firearm safety and hunting experience and permission from instructor.

Email <u>pfarrell@uwsp.edu</u> and provide a short paragraph describing your experience with firearms and hunting, why you want to take the class, and your student ID.

Hunter Education for Women and Girls

Are you interested in having a deeper connection with nature through harvesting your own food This hunter education course instills in students the knowledge and skills to be responsible, safe hunters and promotes ethical use of the environment and our resources. There is a \$10 course fee. Enrollment limit is 20. Class meets Monday nights, 5:30-8:30, for 5 weeks beginning March 30 and ending May 4. Anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 1973, must complete a hunter education course to purchase a hunting license in Wisconsin. Hunter education graduates receive certification that is accepted in all states, Canadian provinces, and Mexico. If you are majoring in natural resources, this is important information for you to learn even if you don't think you will ever hunt. Email pfarrell@uwsp.edu to be added to the class list.
