KENYA SUSTAINABLE NATURAL RESOURCES AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT Study Abroad Course, Summer 2023

The Kenya experience is divided into two components (three for CNR SFE students):

1) Spring Seminar, 1 credit: NRES 475/675

Mondays, 4-5:50pm, starting the Monday after spring break (8 weeks)

This orientation provides background information to help prepare students for the Kenya experience. It also provides an opportunity for students to get to know each other and to prepare logistically for the trip. This seminar is required for all students traveling to Kenya.

2) Kenya Sustainable Natural Resources Study Abroad course, 3 credits: NRES 475/675

Dates: 3 weeks, starting the beginning of June

During this course we travel throughout the country of Kenya, going from very arid, to humid tropical environments. We work directly with people living in rural communities of several Kenyan cultures, working on projects related to water, soil, agriculture, energy, and waste management.

3) CNR Summer Field Experience (SFE) only, Central Wisconsin Environmental Station, 2 credits: NRES 475/675

Dates: 2 weeks immediately following the spring semester

CNR students participating in Kenya to satisfy their SFE requirement will attend a 2-week summer field course at the Central Wisconsin Environmental Station in Amherst Junction, WI. This field course will provide students with essential field techniques in forestry, soils, water, wildlife, and plant identification.

Students:

The Kenya study abroad course is open to students of any major. Both undergraduates and graduate students may participate. Some students are able to complete the Kenya course and spring seminar as part of their Summer Field Experience.

Estimated Program Costs:

The final cost may vary due to multiple factors, such as the number of students participating, program changes, fuel prices, and currency exchange rate fluctuations. Program costs will not be finalized until May 2023.

Financial Aid:

2. Once accepted (you will be notified by email by Nov 7) through the pre-application, you will be required to fill out to complete a full application through the Office of International Education by December 1. See 'deadlines' below for more information.

Selection process & criteria:

- 1. GPA of at least 2.0 overall.
- Space is limited. Generally, students are accepted on a first come, first-served basis.
 Students graduating in spring or summer 2023 will be prioritized as long as they meet the GPA requirement and their application is accepted through the Office of International Education.
- 3. Students wanting to go to Kenya to fulfill part of their SFE requirement will generally be served on a first come, first-served basis. Students graduating in spring or summer 2023 will be prioritized as long as they meet the GPA requirement and their application is accepted through the Office of International Education. If SFE spots fill for 2023, you will be guaranteed a SFE spot for Kenya 2024 as long as you stay in good academic standard.
- 4. Pass a campus and criminal background check after you are tentatively accepted.
- 5. All students need to pass the Kenya spring seminar to participate in the study abroad portion of the program.

Nov 7, 2022 Notification of tentative acceptance via email and electronic permission to register for NRES 475 (spring seminar)

Nov 15, 2022 Passports need to be applied for, no exceptions.

Registration Period Register for NRES 475/675, 1 credit, Kenya spring seminar on your scheduled spring 2023 registration time- Dr. Petrillo will grant you permission to register

December 1, 2023 Formal application DUE to the UWSP Office of International Education

Dec 20, 2023 The \$100 application fee and \$500 non-refundable (but transferable) initial deposit are due through the Financial Services office. All fees must be paid prior to departure.

Proof of vaccination uploaded via the standard university channel on/before December 1.
