University of Wisconsin- Stevens Point Athletic Facilities

BERG GYMNASIUM

(1,365 seats) Women's Basketball, Volleyball, Wrestling

Home to the UW-Stevens Point women's basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams, Berg Gymnasium provides an intimate home-court environment with 1,365 seats. The facility hosted the NCAA Division III women's basketball sectional tournament in 2002 and 2011 and frequently hosts community and campus events. UW-Stevens Point is the only Division III school which boasts two separate facilities for its men's and women's basketball teams. The gym is named for George Berg, who coached football and men's basketball in the 1940's.





BENNETT COURT @ QUANDT FIELDHOUSE (2,787 seats) Men's Basketball

Opened in 1971, Bennett Court at Quandt Fieldhouse serves as the exclusive home to the Pointer men's basketball team and owns one of the largest seating capacities of any facility in Central Wisconsin. The site of the annual Sentry Classic holiday basketball tournament, Quandt Fieldhouse has hosted NCAA Division III men's basketball sectional tournaments in 2005, 2007 and 2010 and women's basketball sectional tournaments in 1987 and 2004. In 2008, the court at Quandt Fieldhouse was named after former Pointer coaches Dick and Jack Bennett. Included in the naming was a complete resurface of the court and a renovation of the front lobby.

Multi-Activity Center (MAC) (54,000 sqft) Track & Field

A spacious 54,000 square-foot facility, the Multi-Activity Center is home to the UW-Stevens Point indoor track and field teams and is used by nearly every Pointer sports team. The facility hosted the 1992 NCAA Division III indoor track and field championships and is frequently used for intramurals and summer camps. It includes four full-length basketball courts and four tennis courts as well as one of the state's premier climbing walls. The facility underwent a renovation in 2008 that included a new Olympic-quality surface on both the track and infield.





UWSP AQUATIC CENTER (8 lanes) Swimming & Diving

The a facility contains an eight-lane racing pool, a separate diving well and a movable bulkhead so training can be done in both meters and yards. The diving well also features two underwater windows. It is home to the university's swimming and diving teams and has four power racks for sprint training. Built in 1991, the facility features a Colorado Timing system with an eight-lane readout. Durafirm diving boards were installed in 2001.

STRENGTH FITNESS CENTER

The goal of the UWSP Personal Training Program is to provide accurate information regarding health and fitness to clients. The information is to be applied in a knowledgeable and respectable manner by keeping the most current facts and science in mind. Our purpose is to accommodate to the recreational lifter, hardcore lifter, and athlete alike through certified personal trainers. The exercises will be completed with up-to-date exercise equipment and a comfortable place in which to use it.





COMMUNITY STADIUM AT GOERKE PARK (4,000 seats) Football

Opened in 1932, historic Community Stadium at Goerke Park is home to the UW-Stevens Point football team. It has seating for over 4,000 fans and a large press box. The facility is city-owned and shares locker room facilities with Willett Ice Arena.

The facility underwent extensive renovations in 2008 and features a FieldTurf surface with a surrounding eight-lane track. The stadium hosted NAIA playoff games in 1987 and NCAA Division III first round contests in 2001 and 2008.

University of Wisconsin- Stevens Point Athletic Facilities

K.B. WILLETT ARENA (1,800 seats) Men's Hockey

A city-owned facility about one mile from campus, K.B. Willett Arena is home to the university's men's hockey team. With a seating capacity of 1,800 fans and seating around most of the rink, Willett Arena provides a raucous environment for Division III hockey. The arena hosted the 1990 NCAA Division III championship series and several NCAA tournament men's and women's quarterfinal games.



McCARTY MEMORIAL FIELD Softball

Located at the corner of Illinois Avenue and Maria Drive, the field is home to the UW-Stevens Point softball team. McCarty Field underwent renovations in 2007 that included new dugouts and bleachers. A new playing surface was also installed. It is named for Diane McCarty, who pitched two seasons for the Pointers and was killed in a car accident following the 1984 season.

POINT SOCCER BOWL Women's Soccer

Located along Illinois Avenue, the Soccer Bowl is the home of the UW-Stevens Point women's soccer team. It hosted NCAA Division III regional tournaments in 1994 and 2002 and was also the site of five NCAA first-round contests. The facility hosted the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference tournament finals eight times from 1999-2004, 2008-10.





UNIVERSITY FIELD

Basebal

Home to the UW-Stevens Point baseball team, University Field is located on campus at the corner of Reserve Street and Maria Drive. The park has dimensions of 330 feet down the lines and 390 feet to center field. University Field has a spacious press box and underwent renovations in the summer of 2007 with the installation of a new infield surface and new dugouts. New bleachers were added in 2010.

ICE HAWKS ARENA (500 seats) Women's Hockey

Opened in 2002, Ice Hawks Arena is the Pointers' newest facility and used by the university's women's hockey team. Owned by the local youth hockey organization, the facility has seating for 500 fans, but plenty of open areas for standing. The arena hosted the NCAA Division III quarterfinal round in 2006 and Northern Collegiate Hockey Association tournaments in 2005 and 2006. UW-Stevens Point has a spacious locker room area with large individual lockers and a training room area.





JOHN E. ROBERTS WRESTLING FACILITY (3,700 sq ft)

Renovated and dedicated in January, 2010, the John E. Roberts Wrestling Facility is named after the founder and longtime coach of the UWSP wrestling program. The facility features a large office and team video area. The area also includes a 3,700-square foot wrestling room with wall-to-wall mats, plaques, records, and pictures of past national champions, and a dedicated cardio area for wrestling. The facility leads directly into Berg Gym, the competition home of UWSP wrestling.
