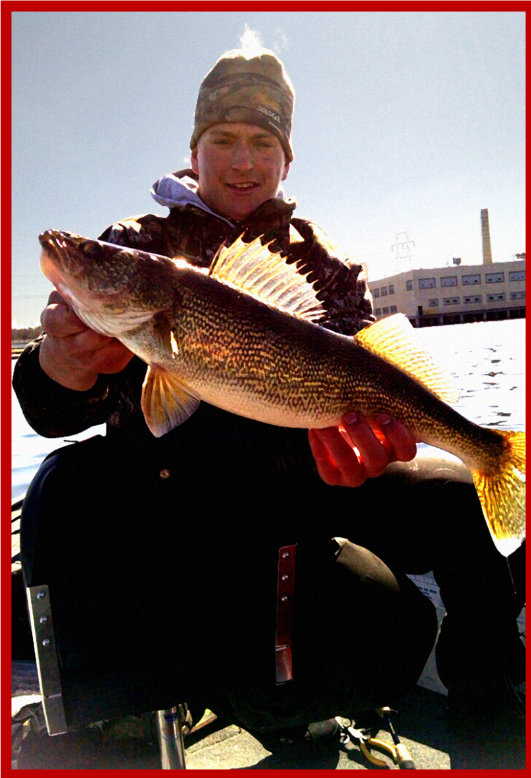

SEE THE BREW CREW IN ACTION!

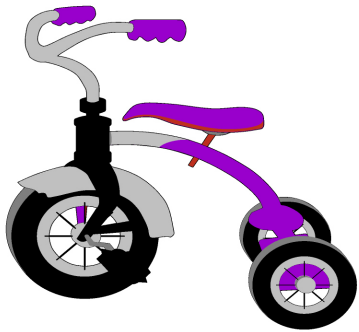

DATELINE: APRIL 14th, 1935

It was known as **Black Sunday**. On the afternoon of April 14, 1935 the residents of the Plains States were forced to take cover as a dust storm, or "black blizzard", blew through the region. The storm hit the Oklahoma Panhandle and Northwestern Oklahoma first, and moved south for the remainder of the day. The conditions were the most severe in the Oklahoma and Texas Panhandles, but the storm's effects were felt in other surrounding areas. The storm was harsh due to the high winds that hit the area that day. Along with the drought, erosion, and the unanchored soil, the winds caused the dust to fly freely and at high speeds. "**The Dust Bowl**" received its name following the disastrous **Black Sunday** storm of April 1935, when reporter Robert L. Geiger referred to the region as "The Dust Bowl" in his account of the storm. After the massive damage caused by these storms, Congress passed the Soil Conservation Act, which established the Soil Conservation Service (SCS) as a permanent agency of the USDA.
