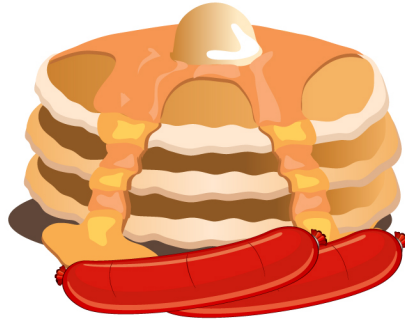

Three years after the Civil War ended, on May 5, 1868, the head of an organization of Union veterans — the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) — established

Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the war dead with flowers. Maj. Gen. John A. Logan declared that Decoration Day should be observed on May 30. It is believed that date was chosen because flowers would be in bloom all over the country.

The first large observance was held at Arlington National Cemetery, during which children from the **Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphan Home** and members of the GAR made their way through the cemetery, strewing flowers on both Union and Confederate graves, reciting prayers and singing hymns.

This day of remembrance is now called Memorial Day.

More recently, in December 2000, the U.S. Congress passed and the president signed into law "The National Moment of Remembrance Act." The National Moment of Remembrance encourages all Americans to **pause wherever they are at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day** for a minute of silence to remember and honor those who have died in service to the nation.

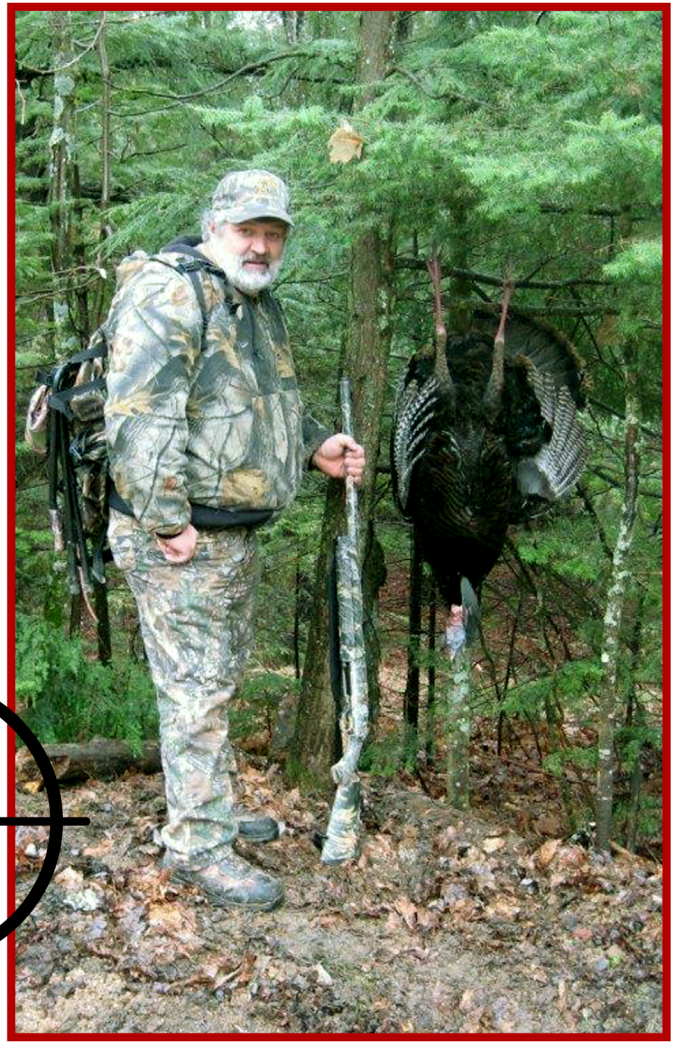
