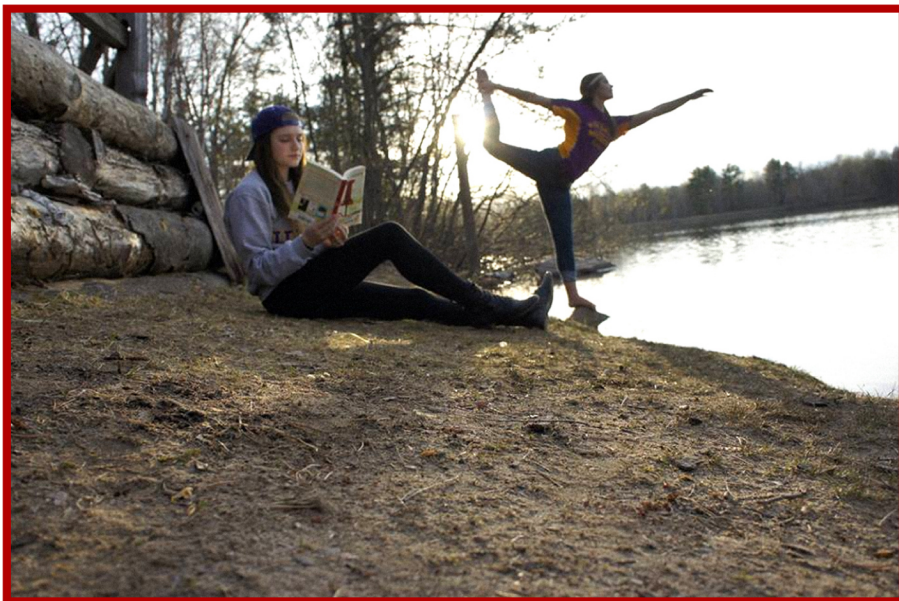

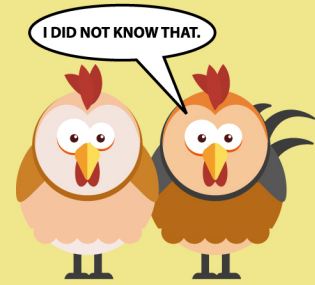

DATELINE: September 17, 1908

The first fatality involving powered flight occurred as a biplane piloted by **Orville Wright** fell from a height of 75 feet, killing **Lt. Thomas E. Selfridge**, his 26-year-old passenger. A crowd of nearly 2,000 spectators at Fort Myer, Virginia, observed the crash of the plane which was being tested for possible military use. Orville survived, but spent a month in the hospital and suffered from recurrent fractures in his hip.
