## UWSP General Biohazard Cleanup Procedures \*\*ONLY USE IF YOU HAVE COMPLETED BLOODBORNE PATHOGEN TRAINING\*\*

## If there is an emergency call 911

- □ If you have completed Bloodborne Pathogens training proceed, otherwise contact Protective Services (x3456)
- □ Cleanup kits are available from Central Stores (P/N 8102104)
- □ Clear and mark off the area: if the spill is too much to clean up with the supplied kits STOP! Immediately call Protective Services (3456).
- □ *Protect yourself:* put on the disposable gloves and splash goggles (if needed).
- □ Spray spill area: use ½ of the small spray bottle of disinfectant. If there is a possibility of the blood splashing, ensure you have on splash goggles and use care to avoid splashing.
- Cover area: use the absorbent blanket marked with the biohazard sign. Use extra towels as needed.
- □ Dispose of the blanket: After all liquid is absorbed, pick up blanket and dispose of in red biohazard plastic bag.
- □ Collect solids: cleanup remaining solids using the two cardboard trays and a rag if necessary; place the solids, cardboard, and rag into the red biohazard bag.
- □ *Disinfect*: spray the remaining disinfectant evenly over the entire area and dispose of the bottle in the red biohazard bag.
- □ Wait: allow disinfectant to remain on the area for 10 minutes. (Area may be slippery when wet).
- Finish with area: wipe the area with a towel or allow the area to air dry.
- □ Remove gloves: peel gloves away from the hands (so they are inside out), do not allow the outside surface of the gloves to touch the skin.
- Dispose of the gloves and all other soiled materials in the biohazard bag and secure bag with the tape provided on the bag.
- □ Clean hands: use the self-drying hand sanitizing gel included with the kit; allow to air dry (no rinsing required)
- □ Thoroughly wash hands under closet available sink.
- Call EHS at ext. 2320: to notify them for a biohazard bag pickup and ensure the proper forms are filled out
- Complete accident report with Supervisor and send copy to EHS department.
- □ Complete exposure report (if necessary): put in supervisor's mailbox.
