The successful applicant will be expected to teach courses within the UCF option, consisting of any of the following: Arboriculture and Landscape Management, Functional Tree Biology, Nursery Management, Ornamental Trees and Shrubs, Tree Care Techniques, and Urban and Community Forestry, Additional teaching responsibilities may include courses aligned with the CNR core curriculum (e.g., Ecological Basis for Resource Management and/or Fisheries, Forestry, & Wildlife) and other forestry courses to develop a full-time teaching appointment. Teaching a minimum of three weeks during the summer in conjunction with the College's Summer Field Experience (at the Treehaven Field Station or elsewhere) or participating in the International Environmental Studies Seminar for additional compensation is required.
