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## **General Information:**

At the end of the semester, each student will give a five-minute presentation on a topic about physics they find interesting. ## **Attendance:**

Attendance of at least 14 of the 15 scheduled classes is **required** for passing the class. Students **must** attend and participate in the final presentations to pass the class. ## **Grading:**

This course is graded on a Pass/Fail basis. In order to pass the class, the student must attend at least 14 of the 15 scheduled classes and complete a "30 second" paper each week. The student must also give a short (approximately 5-minute) presentation to the class on a topic in physics/astronomy of their choice during the last weeks of classes or during finals week (either Wednesday Dec. 7, 14 or Friday Dec. 18).
