ART 103 Learning Outcomes:

1. Students will draw from observation and invention.
 2. Students will design the picture plan and develop spatial illusion using 2D principles and perspective techniques.
 3. Students will analyze work in critiques and demonstrate critical thinking skills.
 4. Students will demonstrate the fundamental skills of craftsmanship using primarily B/W media.

Any demos missed will not be repeated. It is up to the student to learn from a classmate what they have missed, i.e. homework assignments, preparation for the next class (supplies needed, assignments due, etc.).

Assignments are to be submitted on the due date. If you miss class on the date the assignment is due, you (or your representative) have until 4:00 pm to hand in that assignment. Every day late is a grade lowered on your project.

It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to have work ready when it is due! You will be informed if a due date is changed. **Studio courses require outside time of class to work on homework assignments**. It is up to you to communicate if you are having any class related difficulties.

GRADING: Emphasis is placed on your participation in class, exams and completed assignments on the dates due. Each assignment is evaluated by the student's demonstrating they are following instructions and displaying proper technique. Participating in class discussions/critiques and exams are taken into consideration as well.

DURING CLASS PERIOD: - No headphones are to be worn/used during class time. If used, you will be asked to leave and you will be marked absent for that day.

Cellphones can only be used to photograph the various stages of your work. I suggest you photograph each finished assignment. This will provide a digital image for your use and proof of project completion in case your work goes missing.
