Course Goals and Description: Learn about and employ college success strategies, develop an understanding of how higher education and UW-Stevens Point operates, make connections with UWSP peers and the broader Portage County community, and learn about the City of Stevens Point and Portage County offerings.

Student Learning Outcomes: This class is intended to help students:

- Identify and utilize UWSP programs, resources, and services that will support their academic studies and co-curricular involvement.
- Connect with programs, resources, and services in the Stevens Point community that will support their academic studies and co-curricular involvement.
- Develop career, financial, health, and academic literacy
- Identify barriers to college success, as well as ways to overcome those barriers.

Prerequisites:

- 1. **Participation**: Active participation will be required during each class meeting in order to be successful. Engage yourself in the learning process. If you fully participate, you will earn 2 points. If you are present but do not engage in the class (with the teacher/presenter/classmates), you will get 1 point. On CANVAS this will show up as if you were late.
- 2. **Attendance:** You must attend all classes. You are allowed one absence. Every absence from that will lead to a deduction of the grade. (0 points for the missing day)
- 3. **Expert Interview Presentation**: At the beginning of the semester you and a partner will choose a topic. You are responsible for arranging a time with ONE of the guest speakers and interview the speaker after their presentation. You should include questions that the other students post on DISCUSSIONS on CANVAS. The following class, you will present your findings in a 5-minute long Power Point Presentation.
- 4. **Weekly Discussion Board participation:** You are required to post two interview questions that you are interested in asking the presenter of the day. You must post the questions anytime on

- MONDAYS (the day of the presentation). Late submissions will not be accepted and will result in zero points for the discussion section of the week.
- 5. **Reflection Paper literacy topic:** You will submit one written 3-page paper (1,5 spacing, 12 pt. font Arial/Calibri/Times New Roman) about the topic you will choose for your expert interview. An assignment will we posted on CANVAS. You and your partner will write individual reflection papers. An assignment sheet and rubric will be handed out in week 7.
