Education 105 Section 4

Course requirements (to pass this class):


- 1. Participation and Effort: Engage yourself in the learning process. You will only get out of this class what you put in. This course has been set up to be asynchronous, which means you are expected to read the modules carefully and follow directions and submit work before due dates and times. Please email me as soon as you have a question about an assignment, not after it is due.
- 2. **Reflective Writing:** You will write journal entries throughout the next 8 weeks. Journaling is a fantastic way to investigate your own thinking. Being aware of your own thought process, called metacognition, is one goal for this class. Journals that are completed satisfactorily are 300-500 words, typed, and show real thought into the topic. Reflections will be handed in via the Dropbox on Canvas.
- **3.** Assignments: There will be some assignments that reflect the topic for that week. Assignments will be posted within modules on Canvas and all assignments will be handed in via the Dropbox on Canvas.
- **4. Final Essay:** Your final for this class will be a 2-3 page summary paper. I expect you to describe your educational plan in detail with specific references to what you've learned in this course. A separate assignment page will explain this final further.

Most modules contain one assignment and one reflection. Each of these are worth 10 points each.
