Course Goals and Description:

This course is designed for future educators who are pursuing a Wisconsin Department of Education License and are planning to take the Praxis Core exam in its entirety. Alternatively, this course is for future educators who have taken the Praxis Core exam, but need to repeat all three subtests. In this course you will be introduced to the Praxis Core Exam for Educators which includes Writing (5722), Reading (5712), and Math (5732). The lecture portion of the class will cover basic test structure and expectations and will review common challenging areas of each subtest. The lecture portion of the class will be supplemented with a computer lab portion where each student will work on individual skills and identified areas of need. The goal of this course is to adequately prepare the student, both emotionally and academically for the Praxis Core exam.

- Achieve a Passing Score of 150 on the Praxis Core Math Exam by Exercising Core Abilities
- Achieve a Passing Score of 156 on the Praxis Core Reading Exam by Exercising Core Abilities
- Achieve a Passing Score of 162 on the Praxis Core Writing Exam by Exercising Core Abilities
- NOTE: The SOE does has an exception policy for those who have taken the test twice and have scored within 10 points of the passing score. Please see your handbook for details.

Assessment/Grading System:

Attendance

1. Attendance Grade (28 points)

- o Students are expected to attend all class sessions.
- Excused absences require a phone call/email/visit and a very good explanation. All missed work will need to be made up.
- O <u>Unexcused absences are limited to one</u>. Please note that this one unexcused absence will affect a student's grade by -2%. All missed work will need to be made up.

2. Effort/Participation Grade (28 points)

- Come to class prepared

3. Weekly Presentations (15 points)

a. Students will present in each Monday class.



- b. Presentations will be on a problem/question encountered in the previous week's online practice.
- c. The presentation question and the answer should be submitted to drop-box BEFORE class on Mondays.

4. Notes or notecards (4 points)

- Students are expected to make practice notes or notecards for questions/concepts that need review
- Notes/notecards should be well-kept, organized and should be utilized.
- Notes/notecards should be brought to each class.

5. Argumentative Practice Essay (8 points)

- Students will write an in-class 30-minute, timed argumentative essay (2 points).
- The student will schedule and meet with a Writing Lab tutor to discuss the essay and to submit an edited/improved essay (3 points).
- This revised essay will receive feedback from the instructor or a peer consultant.
- The student will revise the essay and resubmit (3 **points**).

6. Informative Practice Essay (8 points)

- Students will write an in-class 30-minute, timed informative essay (2 **points**).
- The student will schedule and meet with a Writing Lab tutor to discuss the essay and to submit an edited/improved essay (3 points).
- This revised essay will receive feedback from the instructor or a peer consultant.
- The student will revise the essay and resubmit (3 **points**).

7. Online Praxis Practice (9 points)

- Students will each have their own online account for Praxis practice.
- Students will log out-of-class study and provide evidence for logged entries when asked.
- In order to receive full points, you must display an average usage of at least 75 min/week outside of class.

8. Final Exam (Needs to be completed to pass)

- The final exam does not affect the course grade. However, in order to pass this course, you must complete the final exam session.
- The score on the final is to help give you a picture of how prepared you are.

Note: Please note that taking this course does not ensure a passing score on the Praxis Core exam. Also note that passing scores on the Praxis are approximately equivalent to the following ACT measures in Wisconsin.

- Overall ACT of 23
- Math ACT sub-score of 20-23
- Reading/Writing ACT sub-score of 20-23
