England to the 18th Century Fall 2021

Course description:

This is a survey of the political, social and cultural history of England (and secondarily Wales, Scotland and Ireland) during the course of its development. It begins with the Roman and Anglo-Saxon invasions and ends with the Hanoverian Succession of 1714, where the story is continued as **History 359**, **Modern Britain**.

Learning Outcomes:

- Describe and analyze major events and historical trends in the history of Great Britain from the first century AD to 1714.
- Summarize, interpret and synthesize the content of textbooks and other historical writing.
