#### **Course Description**

#### This is a 1-credit, pass/fail course.

Class meets every Monday & Wednesday 11:00 – 11:50 a.m. (Room 107 ALB/Library). The purpose of this course is to help you become proficient and discerning in using library resources to obtain relevant information. You will learn information literacy skills, concepts, and strategies for college-level research. You will also learn how to access, use, and evaluate information resources and will become more familiar with the Library.

- **Cite sources** you will learn how to cite your research/sources to use information responsibly and ethically.
