COURSE DESCRIPTION

Environmental policies reflect conflicts over different values. This course addresses the formal and informal processes that transform different values into policies. We emphasize key elements:

- 1. popular attitudes toward environmental problems,
- 2. how groups compete to influence the political process, and
- 3. how the political system shapes what environmental policies can accomplish.

Students conclude by applying what they have learned to a single area of environmental policymaking.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Students will ...

- explain how groups influence and are influenced by environmental policy.
- explain how features of the political process shape which environmental policies are enacted.
