

Course Description

The primary objective of this course is to provide students with a general understanding of the field of criminology. This class is a sociology class, which focuses on crime and criminal behavior. The main focus of this class will be the examination of criminological theories of crime and criminal behavior. We also will examine criminological research, the history of criminology as a discipline; and nature, extent, and patterns of crime and criminal behavior.


Grades
