Once you register and enter your book key, you will have access to the online workbook for a period of 24 months. (If you purchased the workbook for Span 101, you will not need to do so again if you are taking Span 102 within 24 months.)

Course Objectives:

Spanish 102 is a continuation of Spanish 101. Students will gain proficiency in reading, speaking, understanding, and writing Spanish. By the end of the semester, students will have gained familiarity with the present tense, learned to use the preterit and imperfect tenses, and will have been introduced to commands and subjunctive. Students will also learn about different Hispanic cultures and the importance of knowing Spanish in today's global society.

Course Requirements:

- Preparation & homework: The work for this class is completed by the student outside of the classroom. Students are expected to study and prepare the assigned lesson and to complete the homework by designated deadlines. Late homework will not be accepted.
- 2. <u>Tests</u>, <u>quizzes</u> and <u>exams</u>: There will be a quiz, a written and oral test after each chapter and a final comprehensive exam. <u>Makeup tests</u> or exams are not allowed.

- Placement Exam: Placement Exam: The prerequisite for Spanish 102 is Spanish 101 OR
 placement through completion of a UW System Placement Exam. You should already have
 taken this exam. If not, please check with Karin Hyler, Academic Department Associate in
 Room 488. THIS IS NECESSARY IN ORDER TO RECEIVE CREDIT FOR THIS CLASS!!
- 4. Attendance & participation: Regular attendance and active participation in class are absolutely essential for success in this class. Unexcused absences will be documented and 3 or more will result in a reduction in the final course grade (up to one letter grade.) In addition, assignments or quizzes missed due to an unexcused absence cannot be made up. Because classroom participation accounts for 20% of the grade for this course, students who are present in body only and do not participate during class may be disappointed by the effect this has on their grade.

- Attend each class, arriving on time and prepared.
- Participate actively in class.
- Regularly review material from previous classes.
- Don't be afraid to make mistakes!
- Tutoring is available. If you think it might be helpful, please ask sooner rather than later.

- Show your classmates the courtesy you would like to be shown during oral presentations. Give them your complete and undivided attention.
- Relax and be patient. Anyone can learn Spanish!
