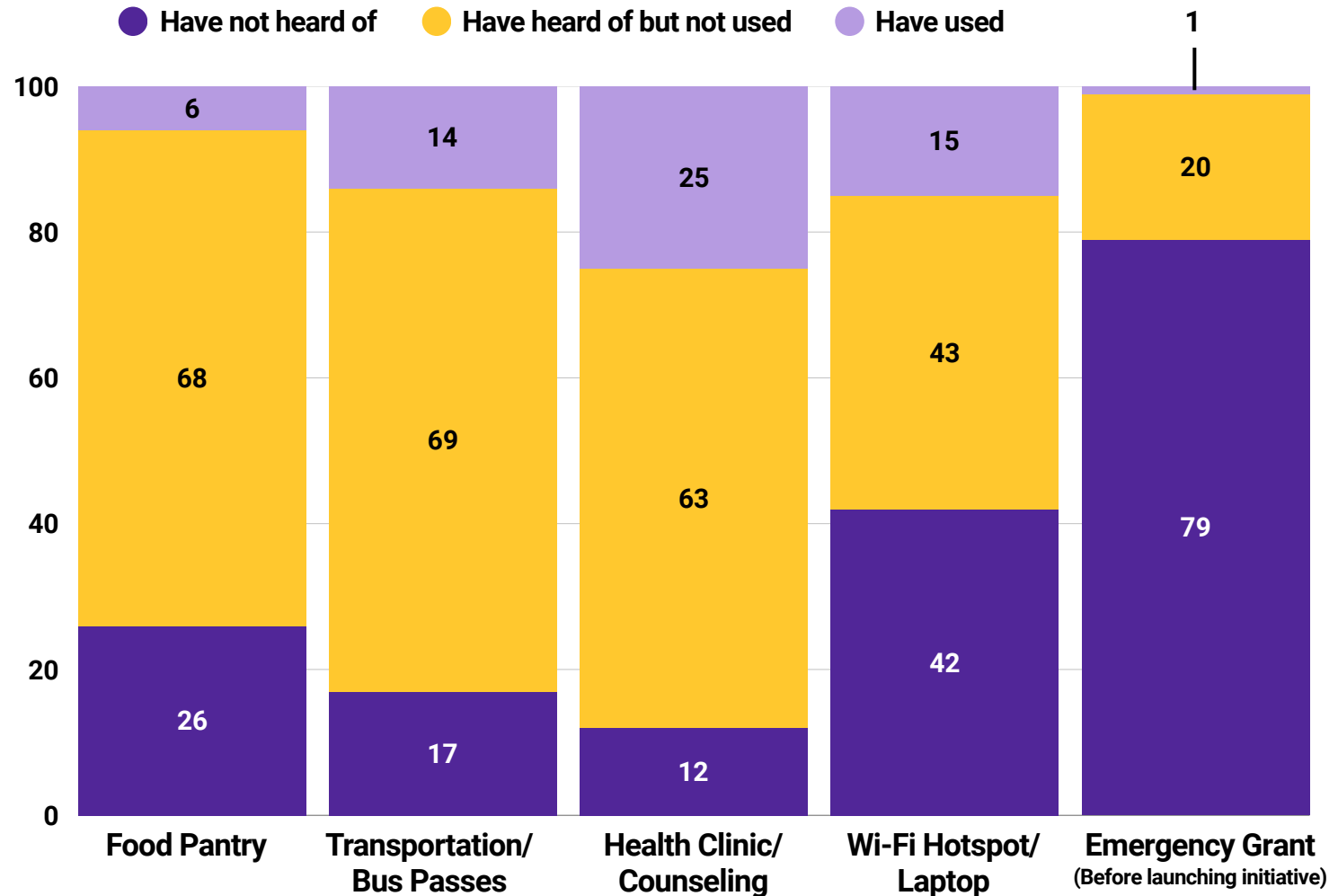

of students experienced one or more challenges that prevented them from having a safe, affordable, and consistent place to live in the previous year. Specifically, 9% of students did not have a fixed, regular, and adequate place to live at some point during the previous year (unhoused)

18%

of students reported unmet mental-health needs. Specifically, 43% of students experienced anxiety and/or depression, with 34% citing an impact on academic performance.

Addressing gaps in students' basic needs is essential to ensure they can continue to pursue their purpose at UWSP. Data on the left indicates the percentage of respondents who have experienced challenges in meeting basic needs. Data below illustrates respondents' knowledge and use of basic needs resources on campus. Information on the second page is provided to help faculty and staff connect students with basic needs resources.
