**NOTES:**

DSN 101 MUST be completed in Semester 1 (fall). This course is a prerequisite for IA 117 and IA 204 which are only offered in Spring (semester 2). A laptop capable of operating the software taught in the IA program is required by the start of Sophomore yr. as a prerequisite for IA 304. Refer to specific laptop recommendations on the IA website.

Summer after semester 4: Can do 1st domestic field experience/internship (IA 394; required for graduation). Completion of domestic field experience/internship is required for study abroad. London study abroad can be 3rd year Spring semester or 4th year Fall semester or summer session. Can do advanced field experience/internship domestically or in London/other Study Abroad programs. Number of credits will vary with program selected.

Students intending to transfer art and/or design credits from prior institutions MUST consult with the Interior Architecture Area Coordinator prior to enrollment in IA or DSN courses.

Typical Offerings: (Fa) = offered fall semesters (Sp) = offered spring semesters (Su) = offered only in summer. To be used as a guide only; subject to change.
