INDIGENOUS LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT STATEMENT

We also recognize that the generations of Native American communities, their cultures, and their knowledge systems shaped the land in a sustainable way that allows us

POSITION SUMMARY

The department seeks candidates for at least one Residence Hall Director position. More than one position may be filled. The Residence Hall Director is a full-time, 12-month, live-in professional staff position and reports to the Assistant Director of Housing and Residence Life. The Residence Hall Director oversees the community building and administrative management of a residence hall housing up to 200-300 students. The main responsibilities of the position include student leader supervision and development, community and education development, student well-being and conduct, and administration management.

In addition, professional development exists through the creation of a professional development plan that would contain a variety of experiences based on the interests and skills of the hall director. Through this position, the Residence Hall Director will provide and promote educational opportunities focusing on awareness and appreciation of cultural differences and building an inclusive and respectful community to prepare our students for a diverse world.

CAMPUS AND ENVIRONMENT

- The University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point is made up of 3 beautiful campuses in central Wisconsin.
- We offer five academic colleges, a variety of programs and degrees, and student support services to help students succeed.
- Our main campus has 406 acres, including the 280-acre Schmeeckle Reserve, which includes a 25-acre lake.

HOUSING AND LIVING

- UWSP has 13 residence halls, including one designated for students who are 21+ years of age and a suite-style apartment building for upper-level students.
- Launched in Fall 2023, UWSP introduced three Themed Community Experiences: the Athletics Community Experience, the Honors Community Experience, and the IDEA Community (Inclusivity, Diversity, Equity, and Accessibility). Starting in Fall 2025, three additional communities will be added: the College of Natural Resources (CNR) Community Experience, the LEAD Community Experience, and the Sentry School Community Experience.
- 5 residence halls use solar energy, and all halls have recycling chutes on every floor.
- UWSP Housing employs over 200 students each year, including Resident Assistants, Desk Receptionists, Project Crew Staff, and Graphic Design Interns.

STUDENT LIFE AND DIVERSITY

- UWSP Diversity and College Access has 4 Resource Centers for students: Queer Resource Center, Multicultural Resource Center, Native American Center, Non-Tradittional Resource Center, and the Student Success Center.
- Diverse and international students make up 13% of the UWSP student population.
- UWSP has over 150 student organizations related to academics, social causes, fine arts, and social/Greek life, including Residence Hall Association (RHA) and National Residence Hall Honorary (NRHH).
- 1 in 3 students work on campus, earning over \$5M in federal work-study funds.
