#### **Indigenous Peoples Land Acknowledgement**

#### **Dramaturg's Note**

UWSP Department of Theatre and Dance originally produced a staged reading of Kodachrome in the 2019-20 season. Our production tonight represents the first time we have used one of our readings for a fully produced production. In our original reading of the play, the dramaturg at the time, Sophie McIntosh (BA Drama Alum) wrote the following program note.

Kodachrome premiered at Portland Center Stage on February 9th, 2018. The play takes its name from the Eastman Kodak Company's celebrated Kodachrome film, which had its own premiere more than eighty years earlier in 1935. Known for its brilliant color palette, high contrast, minimal saturation, and longevity in storage, Kodachrome film was the darling of the photography world until the advent of digital cameras pushed it toward obsoletion. Kodachrome officially ceased production in 2010, and as families dug through old vacation photos and snapshots of Fourth of July picnics, the bold yet shadowed tones of Kodachrome film came to be inescapably associated with the nostalgia of days past.

The same dreamy Kodachrome sheen has seeped into Szymkowicz's play. The Photographer works ceaselessly to capture each moment before it can slip through her fingers, while around her, Colchester's residents cling to old habits and the familiar sights of their hometown in a losing battle against the inexorable march of change within their community and personal relationships. At times, they are so entombed in their nostalgia that they cannot hope to move forward with their lives.

This obsession with the passage of time is echoed in Thornton Wilder's Our Town, another major inspiration for Kodachrome. Both works lovingly chronicle the everyday triumphs and tragedies of citizens in small New England towns, depicting friends and lovers that grow closer and grow apart. Like Kodachrome, Our Town also makes use of a central narrator who disarmingly breaks the fourth wall to share their insights with the audience. Our Town's Stage Manager's observations are impartial and somewhat detached, however, while the Photographer is deeply and personally invested in every character she studies. Her empathy for the people of Colchester colors their interactions and drives the play in unexpected ways.

Ultimately, Kodachrome is not about the study of film or the recreation of a classic play. Perhaps it is not even about Colchester itself, though Szymkowicz certainly paints a fond portrait of his hometown. At its core, the play is about the way people interact and the way people change, and how the two are often tied to each other. In Kodachrome, time threads its way between every smile and every word, converting characters into wistful onlookers of their own existence—but occasionally granting them the reflective wisdom to reach out and change the cycle of their lives.
