1. The acceptance of credits applies only to this Program-to-Program Articulation.
2. For acceptance of equivalent courses, Nicolet College courses must have been completed within the last 5 years. Beyond this period of time, course equivalents will be assessed on an individual basis.
3. This agreement is subject to review if either Nicolet College or UWSP undergoes curriculum revision OR within five years of the origination of this agreement, whichever occurs earlier.

## ADDENDUM

Nicolet College’s Substance Use Disorder Counseling and Human Services Associate A.A.S. degrees are undergoing a curriculum change effective Fall 2023. This agreement reflects the new course numbers/course names.
