**Purpose:** This articulation agreement provides the opportunity for Nicolet College students who have earned credits toward, or who have completed, the Substance Use Disorder Counseling program, to be awarded the following equivalent credits upon entry to the UWSP Social Work Program.

### UNIVERSITY DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

All UWSP students need to complete 40 credits at the 300/400 level and 120 total credits minimum.

### SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

1. Students are only eligible to participate in this agreement if transferring from Nicolet College and formally accepted into the UWSP Social Work Program either prior to or after their transfer. This acceptance requires a formal application process on the part of the student.
2. The acceptance of credits applies only to this Program-to-Program Articulation.
3. For acceptance of equivalent courses, Nicolet College courses must have been completed within the last 5 years. Beyond this period of time, course equivalents will be assessed on an individual basis.
4. This agreement is subject to review if either Nicolet College or UWSP undergoes curriculum revision OR within five years of the origination of this agreement, whichever occurs earlier.

## ADDENDUM

Nicolet College’s Substance Use Disorder Counseling and Human Services Associate A.A.S. degrees are undergoing a curriculum change effective Fall 2023. This agreement reflects the new course numbers/course names.
