- Explore and apply for scholarships from the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies

- · Complete capstone courses (PHIL 480/490/499, or RS 490/499)
- Review your 4-year plan and make sure you have all the necessary courses for graduation
- Explore post-graduation experiences such as Fulbright
- Apply for graduation

- · Ask for help from the Tutoring-Learning Center (TLC) and your professors if you wish to improve
