Welcome to Danstage 2024. We are so happy to be sharing with you another year of beautiful choreography that celebrates the versatility, range, and artistry of the dancers in our program. This year's concert features five dances by the UWSP dance faculty and special guest artist Monique Haley. These dances are wonderfully eclectic and each one captures something essential to our understanding of the world right now.

As I sat in the theatre this week watching the dancers clarify intention, deepen expressivity, and refine the subtleties of content in each work, I was reminded of how important embodiment is. How deeply knowing and experiencing our own body is profound and transcendent. How this marvelous artform we call dance invites us to know the world differently. Through sensing space, time, energy, motion, and emotion, we (and the dancers) are catapulted into realms of understanding far beyond simple facts and figures. What a gift!

Throughout all the works in the concert, mighty communites are fully realized. The dance faculty has been intentional in crafting a journey for you as you watch the whole concert. We begin with Jeannie's group of rhythm-loving tap dancers wholeheartedly digging into the complexities and power of sonic communication in "Out With A Bang!" The space erupts with sound and physical energy. It is something I can't explain, but something you must experience. The charged vitality of the space carries into my new work, "In C, a vigorous study of time," as the dancers weave between, around, over, under, above and below each other revealing a community that tenderly relies on trust, abandon, patience, and connection.

The intermission will give you a chance to catch your breath before you are ecstatically thrust into our guest artist Monique Haley's "The Light." A community built on the inner presence of each member is highlighted through a demanding Africanist informed movement vocabulary that has challenged our dancers to move in new ways. This community recognizes that joy and celebration of the individual is what bonds us all. We first must love ourselves before we can love another. Honoring our earth and all its glory is at the center of "Inhabitants of Tall Grass", a work I originally created in 2012. You are offered a respite here, an invitation to see yourself as part of the simplicity and splendor of nature while taking in the technical prowess of this stunning trio of dancers. Finally, the concert ends with Sarah's powerful and pulsing "Against the Wall." The group, facing seemingly insurmountable obstacles, does not relent. Instead, they harness their collective energy. They push against, they exhaust, they rely on each other until they find a way. It's radical. It's hopeful — and it's exactly what we need right now.

I'm certain you'll leave the theatre feeling these dances in your own body for days to come. If this is true for you, consider these words by the great German choreographer Pina Bausch, "dance, dance otherwise we are lost" and sit with the knowledge that you know and understand the world a little differently now. Be filled with the long-lasting images, ideas, and messages that the choreographers and dancers have given themselves to so fully and see where it takes you.

Thank you for joining us, for bearing witness to the creative process, and for supporting the arts in our community.

Monique Haley is an Associate Professor of Dance and African American and African Studies at Western Michigan University and was recently appointed the Acting Director of the Institute for Intercultural and Anthropological Studies. Monique holds a Master of Fine Arts degree in Dance from The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in performing arts, specializing in jazz dance from The University of the Arts in Philadelphia, PA.

Her research centers on African cultural values, ethos, and the importance of cultivating ritual in contemporary jazz dance pedagogy. Her chapter entitled, Cultivating African Diasporic Ethos and Cultural Values in Contemporary Jazz Dance, is featured in the textbook, Rooted Jazz Dance: Africanist Aesthetics and Equity in the 21st Century. Haley has devised the Diasporic Encounter Method (DEM)—a working methodology to focus the Africanist perspective in the classroom, rehearsal, and creative process.

Monique is a celebrated dancer and choreographer. She honors nine memorable years with the acclaimed River North Chicago Dance Company as the first African American female to join the company in 2001. She has choreographed for notable concert dance companies, musical theatre productions, and collegiate dance companies across the country.
