* For BA--Complete a two-semester sequence of university entry-level world language courses (101, 102). The requirement may be fulfilled through equivalent coursework or other language acquisition as demonstrated through a test-out policy.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

1. All UWSP students need to complete 32 credits at the 300/400 level and 120 total credits minimum.
2. The acceptance of credits applies only to this specific Program-to-Program Articulation.
3. Students are only eligible to participate in this agreement if transferring from FVTC and majoring in Sociology at UWSP.
4. For acceptance of equivalent courses, FVTC courses must have been completed within the last 5 years. Beyond this period of time, course equivalents will be assessed on an individual basis.
5. Students transferring under this agreement must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 in associate program coursework at FVTC.
6. This agreement is subject to review if either FVTC or UWSP undergoes curriculum revision OR within five years of the origination date of this agreement, whichever occurs earlier.
