ELIGIBILITY

Meet UW-Stevens Point's admission requirements and commit to enrolling in UW-Stevens Point for the upcoming fall semester

Identify with one or more of the following groups:

- **A first generation college student** (*neither parent received a bachelor's degree*)
- **Socioeconomic status** (*financial need based on FAFSA*)
- **Have been placed in foster care as a youth, out of home care** (*kinship care, guardianship, group home placement*), **homelessness**, or **were an orphan or ward of the court**

* *International students do not qualify; MAIN CAMPUS STUDENTS only*



ACADEMIC YEAR PROGRAMMING

- 1 One-Week Transition Program Experience:** Participants move into Burroughs hall a week early to ease their transition from high school to college.
- 2 Built-in Community:** LEAD participants will be in the same residence hall, providing a built-in community throughout the year!
- 3 Peer Mentor:** Each student is paired with an undergraduate peer mentor (sophomore to senior level) for support throughout their first-year experience.
- 4 Diversity and College Access (DCA) Success Coach:** Assigned student services coordinators offer support, connecting students to resources for personal, academic, and professional development.
- 5 Monthly Social and Community Engagement:** Planned activities for ongoing social and community engagement.
- 6 Student Engagement:** MRC, NAC, QRC, and Student Success Center offer educational, social, and community programs/events throughout the academic year.
- 7 Scholarship:** Participants will have the opportunity to apply for one of fifteen \$1,000 scholarships during the academic year
- 8 Participant Cost:** FREE!
